In 2021 Porsche announced the return of its "Sonderwunsch" program. Sonderwunsch recently completed and displayed the 996 Classic Coupe inspired by the 1970s 911 Carrera RS 2.7. The car took 2 years to build and alot of input was from our very own PCA. The car is a rebirth of sorts as it started out as a run down 1998 911 Carrera. By the time Porsche was done she had the brakes, chassis and engine from a 996.2 GT3. The interior was reworked in black and gray and added the new PCCM (Porsche Classic Communication Management).



DOG TIRED At Juni Geschwerdigkeit

n Sunday afternoon June 4th you would have found me sitting in a folding chair in garage 8 at Mid-Ohio staring into space, physically fine but mentally drained. I was searching for the energy to finish the weekend as we still had roughly 90 minutes of track time left and we still had to pack up all the gear to head back to Cincinnati. While I was sitting there, I looked over at Miss B, (Gary and Rose Nichols Basenji) sleeping under a blanket. I was trying to figure out how she got tired, then realized that looking at people eating with a forlorn look could be tiresome.

We had roughly 220 participants and 57 guests spend time with us over the course of the weekend. We are incredibly blessed that we had so many volunteer staff, guests, and drivers who took time out of their hectic schedules to be with our incredible HPDE family.

A big piece of our family is the team that works hard to make sure that everything comes together as smoothly as is possible. Planning for June began with a team meeting after the first of the year. Deposits for both of our track weekends are due in December and are non-refundable. At that point we are fully committed to the dates offered by the owners of Mid-Ohio international Sports Car Course. Throughout the spring we look at run group scheduling, special events, and improving previous weekends in whatever way possible.

While all of this is going on, registration has opened and the Okin's are monitoring ClubRegistration.net activities. Dennis and Susan do an incredible job of working registration, getting each person through the registration process handling questions and unfortunately, cancellations. We had more cancellations than in the past and many were due either directly or indirectly to health problems. For all of you that had to cancel due to health problems we wish you the best and pray that all is well for you.

A month out we are already putting in orders for pizza, arranging coffee for mornings at the track, confirming the additional track time we use on Saturdays and having G (our VP) set up the insurance we need to put on a weekend track event where cars are easily doubling normal highway speeds. A couple weeks out we've confirmed that the schedule we sent TrackKeeper is live on their app (and correct) and we've begun picking up all of the beverages/snacks needed for the weekend.

Two weeks out is also the time when one of our chief instructors begin working on the instructor/driver assignments. This is no small task as we have some 55 drivers that are assigned an instructor to work with them throughout the weekend. To make it more difficult for our chief instructors and instructors, we introduced the "intro to DE" group that

required that another 12 drivers have an instructor spend one session with them on track. A big thanks to both of our chief instructors, Gary Nichols and Dale Timmister along with all the instructors who worked tirelessly throughout the weekend to help drivers improve their skills.

With a week to go all our volunteers who haul things up to the track and back now have those items at their homes and are ready to go. Thanks to Dale Timmister, Danny Carmichael, Brian Butt, Eric Bracknell, and Mike Nordloh for getting our gear up to the track and back.

On Tuesday my wonderful wife Becky has been to the Okin's home and now has everything needed to oversee registration at the track. By Thursday morning we are loaded with everything from wrenches to a microwave. I don't think there was a square inch to spare in the truck or in the car on the trailer. Our trip up was uneventful, but the challenges would begin as soon as we got to the track.

I won't go into detail here, but needless to say, Mid-Ohio's local staff wasn't prepared for the size of our group arriving on Thursday. They had not been copied on the communication we had from their corporate office. Several phone calls later we were somewhat back on track. Becky and Rose Nichols had registration up and running outside the gate, giving drivers something to do while they waited.
