A couple weeks ago my son called me. His speech is typically very dialed in, controlled and he weighs his words very carefully. This was different and then he let it spill. He'd been in a car accident. He was fine, a wee bit shaken but his car had been damaged pretty extensively by a 17 year old who thought her car was faster than it was and she was a better driver then she really is. His car will be in the shop for over a month and it'll cost nearly a ½ of the purchase price to repair. Mercifully she was fully insured.

Of course the only thing that really matters here is that my son is ok.

We say things like "It's a car, it can be fixed or replaced". For many of us who have waited decades to finally get the keys it seems flippant and callous to hear: "it's just a car". It's not just a car. It's an extension of ourselves and the achievement of a dream silently kept until satisfied. I've been fortunate enough to witness dreams seeing fruition twice in the last 6 months.

Matt searched the country for his car in the coveted Neptune Blue. We located her in Alabama in February and left the same day to go get her.

There aren't many in the country; it'll never be the VW Beetle in volume and there are perhaps a few dozen in the since discontinued color. But the sheer magnitude of the joy on his face taking the keys for this car defied anything I've seen on Christmas morning. So the despair in his voice really set me back on my heels. He said I know you'll "get" what this feels like. Indeed. I fully understand the relationship some people have with their cars.

This was not just a car, it was not a mere possession to be discounted for some higher noble purpose. Getting the car WAS the higher purpose

How many of us coming up lifes' ranks dreamt of Porsche ownership and knew it would happen if only XYZ would come together? Or said to ourselves "I may have to put this off, perhaps indefinitely. Maybe after the kids are out of the house, student loans are put to rest, my business starts to produce real fruit

How is there no nobility in a desire that drives you?

One of my closest friends since high school, after raising a son and daughter and giving decades of life to his work, is finally in the position to acquire his first Porsche 911. John found her in Iowa, flew to get her and drove the 10 hours home alone. What really struck me was what he said when he brought her to my house to show me: "Everything that has ever troubled me, everything that didn't go my way, every little thing that just ticked me off all of a sudden didn't matter anymore the moment I started that car."

Sometimes desire and acquisition are the most noble causes of your life.

Do me a favor in regards to your Porsche.

- Check your car insurance to make sure it's enough to protect you and your car. I'm not shilling car insurance, but when something happens you need a decent agent in your pocket.
- Be aware of the potential for "diminished value" on your car if God Forbid its wrecked.
- Get a dash cam and learn how to use it. Do it this weekend. Every one of us has encountered a driver in another brand of car that wants to see what the vaunted Porsche is capable of. How many Mustangs leaving cars and coffees do you really need to see to know I speak the truth?
- Buy a good radar detector, don't skimp. Mike Valentine can direct you to a very good one. (yeah Im shilling, I have two and I swear by them.)

Alcohol And OVR/PCA Events

I have been recently asked about PCA policy regarding the use of alcohol at any of our events. It is as follows:

"THE PCA ALCOHOL USE POLICY The consumption of alcohol during competitive driving events is forbidden. After the competition has been completed, a driving event can be treated like any other gathering of PCA members. At such gatherings of PCA members, the availability of and consumption of alcohol is not forbidden. Further, PCA insurance policies do not prohibit the consumption of alcohol at PCA gatherings. However, good risk management practices require a common sense approach to the administration of PCA gatherings where alcohol is available. Many Regions already utilize intensive and well thought-out practical measures to control the availability and consumption. There are a number of risk management techniques available and Regions are encouraged to share techniques that have been utilized successfully with fellow Club members. PCA's objective is to practice good risk management at PCA events in order to protect our Club and its members from incidents and accidents."

Bellefontaine Tour Reaches New Heights

On the last Saturday of August, seven Porsches jitterbugged across 114 miles of bucolic backroads that wound around an array of farm hamlets stretching from Milford to the launching pad of the storied Bellefontaine Hill Climb racetrack.

Despite the overcast skies with predictions of rain early in the ride, nary a drop landed on our cars, while the skies slowly brightened as we drove closer to our destination. During the three hour jaunt to the hill climb, we skirted around Stonelick Lake and Cowan Lake, while hopscotching in and out of scenic towns like Blanchester, Wilmington, Jamestown, South Vienna, and Mechanicsburg. While passing through tiny Port William we were treated to the passing waves from an elderly jokester who was seated on his front porch comfortably perched on a toilet!



Take Me Home Athens County Roads

With Apologies To John Denver

Whew! Another fabulous Athens County, Ohio Back Roads Tour was completed successfully; and this time, we even dodged a tornado! You know what they say, "third time's the charm."

It was indeed a spectacular weekend, not too hot with no precipitation while maneuvering curvaceous roads and hilly routes that wrapped around and in between several counties across scenic SW Ohio. It was a wonderfully entertaining event, with confirmed reservations for fifty cars – a new record! The secret is out, making this two-day tour one of the premiere annual events for OVR members to enjoy their P-cars while making new friends.

Most participants pulled into the Ohio University Inn and Conference Center beginning Friday afternoon and into the evening. Hanging around the bar area, we checked-in participants, gathered signatures, renewed friendships from past tours and made some new friends as well.

At the crack of dawn on Saturday, we enjoyed the buffet breakfast and grabbed a cup of coffee before meeting in the lot across the street for the Drivers' Meeting at 7:45 AM. Four LEAD cars were designated with a parade of a dozen cars to follow behind each lead vehicle. Our first official tour group snaked away from the lot at 8:05 AM with the remaining three groups following at seven minute intervals to create an almost half hour of wonderfully rumbling exhaust crescendos, as each car accelerated away from the holding lot.

Our morning outing linked 130 miles of endless switchbacks that circled around and through a myriad of mature forests and hills flourishing with green fields and beautiful small farm settings. For three glorious hours, we bounded through a variety of small towns before reaching historic Marietta, Ohio where we gathered for a welcome break and lunch across the Ohio River at Da Vinci's, a restaurant in Williamstown, West Virginia.

The restaurant was expecting us; well prepared with space, staff and a variety of meal selections readily available. As each group finished lunch, the second set of backwoods roads was put into active service.

The afternoon route may have only covered 123 miles within three hours, but its' roads were just as spectacular as the morning run. Following our four group format, we were off again, passing through small towns in a blink of an eye such as Watchtown, Wolf Creek, McConnelsville and Ringgold, where we picked up the famous Triple Nickel (aka OH-555). Treated to gorgeous scenery all along that twisty route through Chesterhill, Barrett, Culter, Fillmore, Little Hocking, Torch and Coolville; we reluctantly turned onto OH-50 and followed it back to the Inn for some well-earned rest and refreshments.

Saturday's Social Hour began at 6:00 PM in the Inn's all-glass solarium with a variety of delicious selections from the kitchen and a cash bar. Tour participants enjoyed the snacks, beverages and the opportunity to get to know each other, while sharing their personal experiences driving the challenging roads in this region of Appalachia.

As people mingled and found more common ground, a number of "new" friends initiated the opportunity to have dinner "uptown" in Athens. Unfortunately, as the quest to arrange dinner reservations began, so did the rain. Suddenly, it was pouring in torrents, just outside the glass solarium where we were socializing, making us all ever so grateful that we had dodged that rainstorm bullet during our driving that day!

Then suddenly, the Emergency Siren sounded and the Inn's staff began corralling all guests and ordering everyone to take immediate shelter in the lower level of the building. Later we learned that an EF1 tornado with an estimated wind peak of 100 mph had touched down at 7:33 PM near


Angel Ridge Road, carving a path 2.33 miles long and 300 yards wide. Later, the tornado headed northeast, crossing Gura Road, Long Run Road and North Coolville Ridge Road before lifting just past Kincade Road

Loading cars on Sunday morning, we were greeted with cheery sunshine and dry pavement, which helped dim the memory of the previous night's wild monsoon. Breakfast was a buzz with shared tales of the tornado and anticipation for the final three hour drive of 122 miles from Athens, Ohio to Logan, Ohio where a Cars and Coffee Event, (organized by Tony Venzin) would mark our final tour destination.

Following the same departure scenario after breakfast, everyone gathered for a brief Drivers' Meeting and soon left the parking lot using the same exit strategy; giving each LEAD a seven minute head start, before dismissing the subsequent group. Once again, the route was spectacular, making the tour's finale an excellent morning ride that traversed well-paved roads from a southern point on the Triple Nickel (OH-555) and headed northwest toward Zanesville. From there we headed due west, and finally sped south to our Logan, Ohio end point in scenic Hocking Hills, where we were greeted by almost 100 sparkling cars representing a variety of sports car clubs from across the region.

We're happy to claim another successful Athens County, Ohio Back Roads Porsche Tour.






